FROM THE GROUNDS:

Happy October!The golf season is flying by but our best month is still ahead. October brings the Fall colors and some of the best golf of the year. The grass's growth slows down with the cooling soil temperatures and we lose the moist air (humidity). All this plays into great scenery and great playing conditions.

For those of you that are new to the club September is when we take on one of the most beneficial cultural practices we do to our fairways. Right after Labor Day we topdress our fairways with sand. Typically we apply about 1/4"- 3/8" of sand in conjunction with an aerification. We have been doing this since 2013.

We committed to undertaking this practice to improve the firmness and drainage in our fairways. Most of our fairways are grown on peat soils that tend to hold moisture once wet. As this photo shows, we have accumulated about 2.5" since starting and it has had a huge impact on fairway conditions. A lot of the time rain events would cause us to have a lot of casual water conditions. This makes it tough to play and tough to mow. We



rarely skip more than a day of mowing now. In fact when we have had a day of carts on path only we prefer that when restrictions are lifted that you keep carts in fairways over driving in the rough.

As with any golf course work there are inconveniences that occur. We are thankful that our membership values the long-term benefits of this practice over the slight inconvenience of hole closures and sandy conditions in the short-term.
